Rational treatment is based upon an understanding of the basic principles of body unity, self-regulation, and the interrelationship of structure and function.





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Admissions Requirements

1. Bachelor's Degree from an accredited US institution conferred before July 1 of the intended matriculation year
2. Must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident (green card holder), or DACA recipient
3. Minimum 3.0 Overall GPA (3.4 Overall BCPM recommended)
4. Minimum 498 MCAT with no subsection below 123 (within the previous 3 years)
5. One Composite Letter from Pre-Health Committee OR 3 LORs- DO recommended
6. Demonstrated Commitment to service/community by involvement in outreach, advocacy, or service
7. Successful completion of a background check

Plains to Peaks Pathway

- Residents or students attending a UG or Graduate Institutions in targeted states (CO, WY, NM, OK, KS, TX, MT, UT, ID, NE, SD, ND) applying to medical school will have a guaranteed interview if they meet the following criteria:
 - Meet the minimum academic and admissions requirements as published in UNC COM's Admissions Requirements Policy.
 - Earn a Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) score of 502 or higher within three attempts
 - Hold a 3.5 or higher overall or graduate school BCPM (science) GPA
 - Complete AACOMAS Application sent to UNC COM
 - Complete UNC COM Supplemental Application
 - Payment of the UNC COM \$75 supplemental application fee
 - First Come First Serve
 - Must Pass Screening







December	UNC COM application opens on AACOMAS
December	Supplemental Invites Sent
January	Admissions Committee begins reviewing applications
January	Interviews begin
March – June	UNC COM extends acceptance offers
April 1	Supplemental application closed
May 1	Enrollment deposit due
July 1	Matriculation documentation and background check due
